

Jesus or Mohammed - The Truth of the Bible and the Claims of the Quran

1. The Uniqueness of Jesus

Jesus is the only person in history to fulfill more than 300 prophecies written centuries before His birth.

Examples include:

- Born of a virgin (Isaiah 7:14; fulfilled in Matthew 1:22-23)
- Born in Bethlehem (Micah 5:2; fulfilled in Matthew 2:1)
- Betrayed for 30 pieces of silver (Zechariah 11:12-13; fulfilled in Matthew 26:14-16)
- Crucified with criminals (Isaiah 53:12; fulfilled in Luke 23:33)
- Raised from the dead (Psalm 16:10; fulfilled in Matthew 28)

These prophecies were written hundreds of years before Jesus and fulfilled in detail.

2. The Claims of the Qur'an

The Qur'an was written around 600 years after Jesus. It claims Jesus was only a prophet, not the Son of God (Surah 4:171), and denies His crucifixion (Surah 4:157-158). It acknowledges Jesus' virgin birth and His miracles (Surah 3:45-49), but rejects His divine nature.

The Qur'an was revealed to Muhammad in private, with no witnesses. In contrast, Jesus' life, death, and resurrection were seen by thousands. Over 500 people saw Jesus after His resurrection (1 Corinthians 15:6).

3. The Life of Mohammed

Mohammed claimed to be the final prophet, but he fulfilled no prophecies. He did no miracles as Jesus did.



There were no eyewitnesses to the Qur'an's revelation, and his life involved political and military power, including violence and conquest.

The Bible teaches that true prophecy is confirmed with witnesses (Deuteronomy 18:22). Jesus' entire ministry was public.

4. The Bible vs. The Qur'an

The Bible was written by over 40 authors on 3 continents over 1500 years, yet it tells one unified story-God's plan of salvation through Jesus Christ.

The Qur'an was written by one man, without prophetic validation, centuries after the Bible. It contradicts earlier Scripture while claiming to confirm it (Surah 2:41; 5:46). The Bible warns against later revelations that deny Jesus' nature (Galatians 1:8).

5. Jesus and the End Times

The Bible presents Jesus as the returning King (Revelation 19:11-16), while the Qur'an presents a version of Jesus who denies the cross and supports the Mahdi. Islamic eschatology paints a picture opposite to the Bible: the Mahdi resembles the Antichrist, and their version of Jesus resembles the false prophet.

This shows a spiritual conflict-only one can be true.

6. Why Christianity Is True



Christianity is based on historical, prophetic, and eyewitness truth. Jesus proved His divinity with signs, fulfilled prophecies, love, and power over death.

John 14:6 - Jesus said, 'I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me.'

Acts 4:12 - 'Salvation is found in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given to mankind by which we must be saved.'

7. A Loving Invitation

This study is not about hate, but truth in love. God loves all people and invites everyone to know Him through Jesus. The Bible says:

Romans 5:8 - 'But God demonstrates His own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us.'

John 3:16 - 'For God so loved the world that He gave His one and only Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish but have eternal life.'

Seek the truth with an open heart, and you will find Jesus-the Way, the Truth, and the Life.
